



Vanilla Loom Hat

Materials Needed:

Round Loom & loom tool
Super Bulky Yarn

Notes: I did not make up this pattern. It is a pretty basic roly brim loom hat pattern that has probably been done a hundred times over. I just could not find much information on what size loom to use for hats and how long to make them. So I decided to write out what I do to make loom hats!

Sizes: For baby through child sized hats, use a 24-peg or 30-peg round loom. For adults, use a 36-peg or 40-peg round loom.

To begin, make a slip knot and place it on the anchor peg. Move the working yarn to the inside of the loom between the first and last pegs. Wrap the yarn around the first peg clockwise. (Do this somewhat loosely). Continue until you have worked every peg. Push the loops down to the bottom of the peg and repeat for round 2. After you have two loops on all of the pegs, use a loom tool and lift the bottom stitch over the top stitch and off the peg. Do this all the way around. You will have one stitch remaining on the pegs at the end of the round. Repeat with wrapping the yarn in a clockwise direction until you reach the beginning of the round again, and again having two stitches on each peg. Repeat lifting the bottom stitch up and over the top stitch and off of the peg.

Continue doing this until you have reached:

baby - 7 inches

child - 8 inches

teen/small adult - 9 inches

large adult - 10 inches

CO, leaving a long tail (20 inches or so). Finish off by stitching the opening at the top with a tapestry needle and the long tail that you left from the CO. Weave in your ends.
