

Knit - wool or Acrylic - see pattern

Wildlife Outer Pouch – Circular needles version

Small – 24cm square, ^{9 1/2"} Medium – 30 cm square ^{11 3/4"}

8ply yarn, pure wool or acrylic

4mm Circular needle, 40cm length ^{15 3/4"}

Cast on 100 (130) stitches.

Tip – it is easier to cast on and count stitches using a pair of regular straight needles, then knit first row onto the circular needle.

Bring the points of the circular needle together, place a marker, and continue working in rounds.

Do at least 8 rounds in garter stitch – one round knit, next round purl – to stabilise the top.

If using acrylic yarn, continue in garter stitch.

Wool – use stocking stitch (all rounds knit) or garter. I make a garter band midway.

Work to 20 (26) cm. Place a 2nd marker opposite the first so 50 (65) stitches are between markers.

Knit 2 stitches together either side of each marker. Continue until required length.

Cast off remaining stitches loosely, leave a long tail of yarn to sew up the seam on the outside, so inside of pouch is completely bump free.
